**ICA San Diego's Fall 2025 Exhibition, Las Hermanas Iglesias:  
*wontloversrevoltnow* Opens in Encinitas August 16**

*Contemporary Art Exhibition Will Span Entire ICA / North Campus*



**San Diego, Calif. (August 14, 2025)** — The Institute of Contemporary Art San Diego (ICA San Diego) continues its 2025 “On Healing” exhibition season with works by artists and sisters, Las Hermanas Iglesias. Their exhibition, [wontloversrevoltnow](#), spans the entire ICA / North campus and invites visitors into a conversation about health, care, and community.

Through a combination of existing work and new projects created specifically for this exhibition, Las Hermanas Iglesias generously weave their own navigations of loss, motherhood and current events into works that speak to how we value, define, and provide caregiving. Recent years have made disturbingly clear the high stakes of healthcare access and childcare support, as well as the continued fight for reproductive justice in the United States and beyond. In *wontloversrevoltnow*, the sisters expand this conversation to consider how practices of love and nurturing can help us navigate this current moment.

“There is such an elemental humanness in Las Hermanas Iglesias’s work. From the familiar forms, to the word play and perceptual challenges, to the relationships between objects and structures, this exhibition highlights the human connections that sustain the social systems in which we all participate,” said Jordan Karney Chaim, PhD, Curator of ICA San Diego.

Artists Lisa and Janelle Iglesias (b. 1979 and 1980), who have worked collaboratively as Las Hermanas Iglesias since 2005, visualize the interconnected social systems that govern not only human behavior but our survival as well. Working collaboratively with other family members including their mother and children, and often the public, their projects and installations find a balance between multiplicity, deep empathy, and play.

As part of the exhibition, ICA San Diego has commissioned Las Hermanas Iglesias to create more than a dozen site-specific works, including:

- The multi-part installation, *Heart Before the Course*
- *Chewing the Doors*, a series of sculptural paintings
- *Pleating and Humming*, a floor installation made in collaboration with Bee Worthy Farms in Encinitas
- *Wontloversrevoltnow*, a neon sculpture
- Multiple embroidered textile pieces

**Opening Reception at ICA / North in Encinitas is Free to the Public**

**wontloversrevoltnow** opens Saturday, August 16 during ICA San Diego's C You Saturday! event at ICA / North in Encinitas from 4-7pm. The event is free to the public, and includes all-ages art-making, an exhibition walk-through with Las Hermanas Iglesias and curator Jordan Karney Chaim, and food and beverages for purchase. A companion podcast episode featuring Las Hermanas Iglesias will be released on the [ICA San Diego podcast](#) in the coming weeks. *wontloversrevoltnow* runs through December 27.

Additionally, ICA / North will now observe the following new exhibition opening hours: Saturdays & Sundays from Noon - 5pm. ICA / North will remain open during the week for art, ceramics, and photography [classes and workshops](#), as well as [Weekly Wellness Saturday events](#) in conjunction with the *On Healing* exhibition season.
